Following the tragic natural disasters in 2017, they kept hearing from people they knew who were affected about how most things are replaceable, but photos and other precious memories are not. So, they decided to create a business to help people protect their most important life memories and documents. The result is [The Cloud Life](#).

“We are both old souls, with lots of family traditions and memories,” said Anna, who grew up in Woodside and now lives in Atherton. “We felt that there was a huge need in the marketplace for someone to come into people’s homes and organize and digitize everything they feel is important.”

Those items can be important documents, photos, home videos, art work and children’s art work. Once everything is scanned, [The Cloud Life](#) offers three different storage options:

- A private secure cloud (that requires two factor authentication and insures the highest safety precautions when it comes to virtual storage)
- An external hard drive
- A Fort Knox style vault that will store hard copies of important documents as well as an external hard drive. This is an off-site vault that is in a fireproof and earthquake resistant building.

“Our motivation is to help others,” said Brittany, a Menlo Park resident. “Most people don’t have the time or energy to take on a project like this.

“What surprised us is that it’s the grandchildren who are often the family members that are most excited. That’s brought us much joy!”

Added Anna: “The older generation may have the emotional connection but it’s the younger generations who are motivated to have the memories preserved.”
